Thinking Ahead

The goal of forming a vision statement is to form a boundary for change in the church. The vision of the church is the thing which we can point to as an explicit reason for change; if anything in the church gets in the way of the vision, it should be removed. If resources could be used more efficiently to achieve the vision, they should be reallocated. If new programs, ministries, or structures could benefit the vision, they should be implemented.
